You can still discover them and integrate them into your community.

The goal is that each growing house can grow into a healthy church/family, where all the aspects are lived together that are handed down to us from the first church in Acts 2; 36-47.

> Such churches, gathering here and there in homes and multiplying, are lighthouses for the people around them and show Jesus to the world. (You can find more details in the "Toolbox").

Sheep without a shepherd go astray. Mark 6:34; John 10:11-15

Leaders grow up, they are given by God and gifted differently. They serve others and build them up. They do not exalt themselves, but are role models as fathers and mothers who bring their sons and daughters to maturity and set them free. Proverbs 15:22; Ephesians 4:11-16; Matthew 23:8-12; 1 Timothy. 4:12-16

Leaders study the Scripture. 2 Timothy. 4:2-5; Titus 1:5-9.

Give an account of where you are at with your goals on "Follow & Fish" that you set last week. (Mark 1:17)

Read Acts 2:36-47 and draw the church circle to define a vision for a healthy church. (p. 19)



#### $SCRIPTURE \rightarrow$

Read aloud the first chapter of Mark.

- 2. Read the chapter several times: Mark 1
- 3. Discover: pray and then use the previously applied questions to discover the Bible. You can also use additional discovery questions:

#### e.g. the S.T.A.R. method, S.T.A.R. means:

- Scripture= Scripture; Read the passage again silently.
- Think= Think; think personally about what you Read.
- -Application= application; what can you take away and apply from it, choose a specific verse or topic that speaks to you or challenges you.
- -Reminder= Reminder; create a short mnemonic, (a word, song, phrase) so you can easily remember through the coming week your word that God has spoken to you and give it the possibility to shape you.

or the **P.R.O.C.** method, which helps you discuss the story and reveal its meaning for our lives. **P.R.O.C.** means:

- Promise you want to claim?
- Role model you want to follow?
- Order you want to follow?
- Correction you want to take?

#### SET GOALS ->

Follow: What, from today's lesson, does Jesus want you to follow in the coming days? Fish: To whom do you want to pass on what you learned in this lesson in the days ahead?

#### COMMISSION →

Pray as God leads you and continue to pray for love and courage. Ask for wisdom on how to proclaim the gospel and make disciples. Continue to pray for all those who are on your "oikos map." Pray for harvesters and for multiplication. Pray for 4<sup>th</sup> generation disciples and churches and God's kingdom to spread to the ends of the earth- that no place will be left and Jesus can come again.

### LONG-TERM DISCIPLESHIP READING PLAN

Now that you have completed the 15 STEPS of "Following Jesus," you can move on to "long-term discipleship" using the 3/3rds "three-thirds" format (below) and the Bible Discovery Questions as your method. This will allow you to learn more Bible passages in new steps and discuss them together. We suggest that you begin with the Gospel of Mark, following the schedule below. When you are finished with Mark, we suggest you continue with another book of the Bible or a thematic study using Scripture passages.
